



# READING!



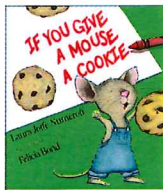
Reading stories and books to your child helps with language development, promotes bonding and communication between parent and child, builds listening, thinking and imagination skills.

While reading ask child to point to or name items in pictures (helps build vocabulary).

Ask questions about what's going on (answering questions).

Before moving onto next page/paragraph ask child what he/she thinks may happen next (predicting).

Recreate acts that are similar to what happened in a story; act out scenes, make something from the book, draw pictures of scenes (helps with retention).
